The attractions are the concept of four-time Emmy award-winner Jeremy Railton, whose professional credits range from celebrity musical stages to Olympic opening ceremonies.

Lake of Dreams is a musical extravaganza that dramatically choreographs synchronized high-speed water jets and flaming fire pits into a nightly celebration of fantasy and reality. To bring the attraction to life, KHS&S International worked with the building team, in a design-assist role, from concept to final execution, playing a key role in nearly every aspect of this one-of-a-kind resort focal point. In addition to supplying and installing the attraction's signature glass fiber reinforced polymer (GFRP) "vines" that, during the performance, transform into fire-breathing dragons, KHS&S International also provided rough and finish electrical, the laser light show, all lighting fixtures, structural steel and the performance elevator.

Chamber of Treasures is a multisensory escalator journey that transports visitors to the resort's casino via a kaleidoscope of sounds and sights that showcase the work of world-renowned glass sculptor Dale Chihuly. KHS&S International provided turnkey attraction services, including design assistance, architectural & engineering drawings and supplied and installed the lighting trusses and mirrored wall panels that create the backdrop for this surreal visual spectacle. KHS&S International also provided rough and finish electrical and all lighting fixtures.
